The Ohio Public Facilities Maintenance Association (OPFMA) is a (501)(c)(3) not for profit organization devoted to continuing education and professional development of public facilities maintenance employees throughout Ohio. OPFMA organization was created in 1987 for the public maintenance personnel only and it strives to assist their ever growing job requirements. OPFMA receives the support of Ohio Department of Development the Office of Energy Efficiency since 1987.

The organization interacts with official state agencies, associations and organizations such as Ohio Department of Development- Office of Energy Efficiency, Ohio School Facilities Commission, Ohio Board of Regents, and Department of Administrative Services, as well as other trade organizations such as Buckeye Association of School Administrators, Ohio Association of School Business Officials, and others to promote energy efficient use of equipment, old and new, safety and preventive maintenance. It provides training for building operators and a forum for maintenance supervisors and other administration level officials.

OPFMA offers its members benefits what could assist members' in their work performance:
